CALL FOR PAPERS

The *International Journal of Central Banking (IJCB)* is organizing its 2014 research conference on the topic of **Policies for Macroeconomic and Financial Stability**. The conference will be hosted by the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia on September 26-27, 2014, and will be organized by Harrison Hong, Loretta Mester, Rafael Repullo, and John Williams. Six to eight papers will be selected from among those submitted in response to this announcement. After the normal refereeing process, the conference proceedings (including papers and comments) will be published in a special issue of the *IJCB*.

The global financial crisis of 2007-2009 and its aftermath have highlighted the important interactions between macroeconomic policies aimed at fostering economic stability and those aimed at fostering financial market stability. Unconventional monetary policies and other policy interventions that have been used to stem the crisis and promote economic recovery have had an impact on financial markets and institutions, while changes to financial regulation and supervision, including new capital and liquidity requirements for financial institutions, are likely to affect the transmission of monetary policy and interact with other macroeconomic policies. The conference will focus on the open questions of how to design central banks, financial supervisory authorities, and other policymaking institutions and the policies they should pursue to best achieve the goals of economic and financial stability.

In addition to papers that address these questions directly, the conference will include papers that provide theoretical models and empirical results that will help us understand the issues involved. It will attempt to draw together the lessons learned from the crisis, combine them with new contributions, and lay the foundation for further research.

Submission guidelines: Complete manuscripts (not abstracts) should be sent in PDF format to sf.ijcbfallconference@sf.frb.org and must be received by March 15, 2014. Manuscripts submitted for this conference may *not* be under review at any other journal. The authors of the accepted papers will be notified by April 30, 2014 and will receive editorial comments so that the paper can be revised for presentation at the conference and be considered for publication in the *IJCB* in 2015.
